
Wildlife: Offer to help the local filmmakers

international market."



Scubazoo is a media company established in Sabah which has 20 years experience in actively filming and documenting reality shows on wildlife rescues through entertaining and informative series such as Borneo From Below, Borneo Jungle Diaries and the latest TV series, Borneo Wildlife Warriors.

Borneo Wildlife Warriors, which will premier next Wednesday, features a weekly series about wildlife animals in the jungles of Sabah and the people who commit their lives in protecting them through rescue and relocation missions.
